

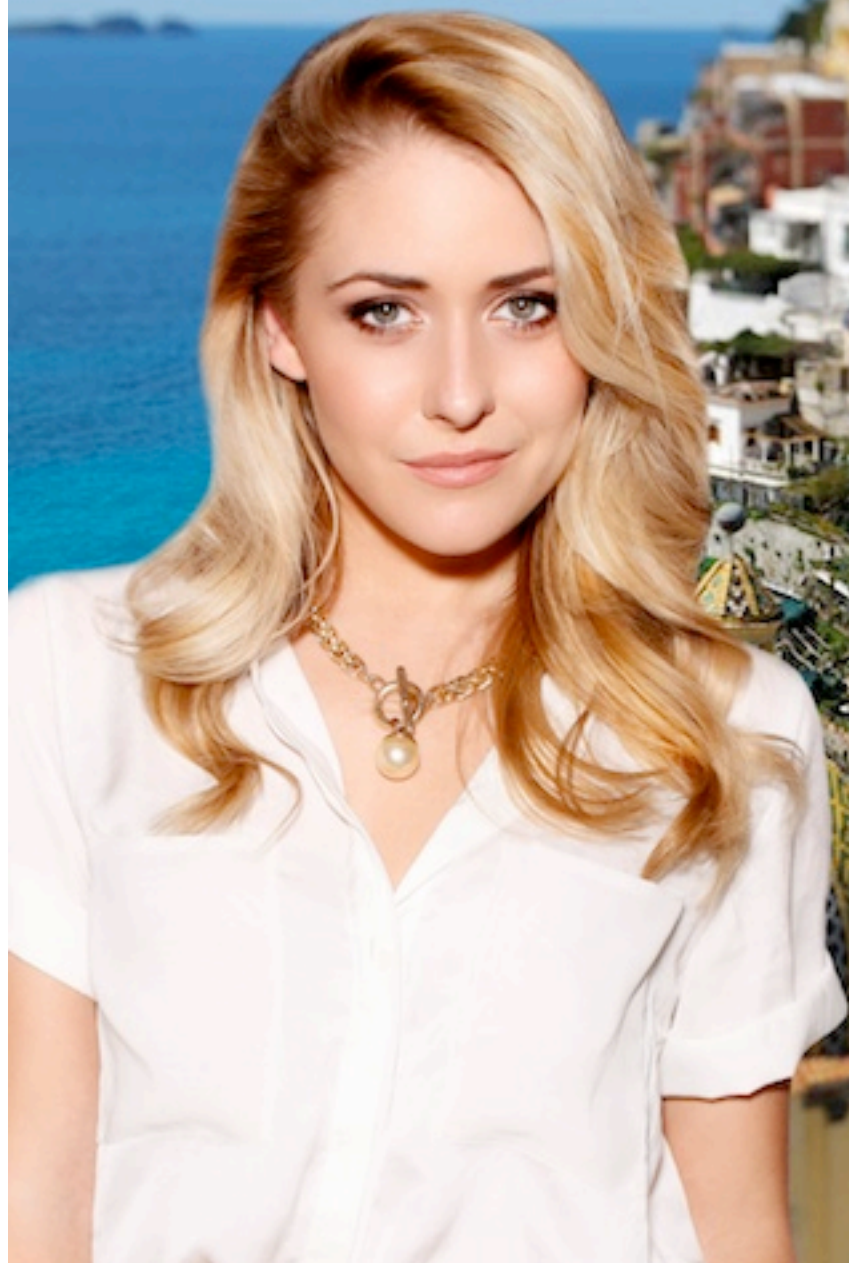

Episode 1

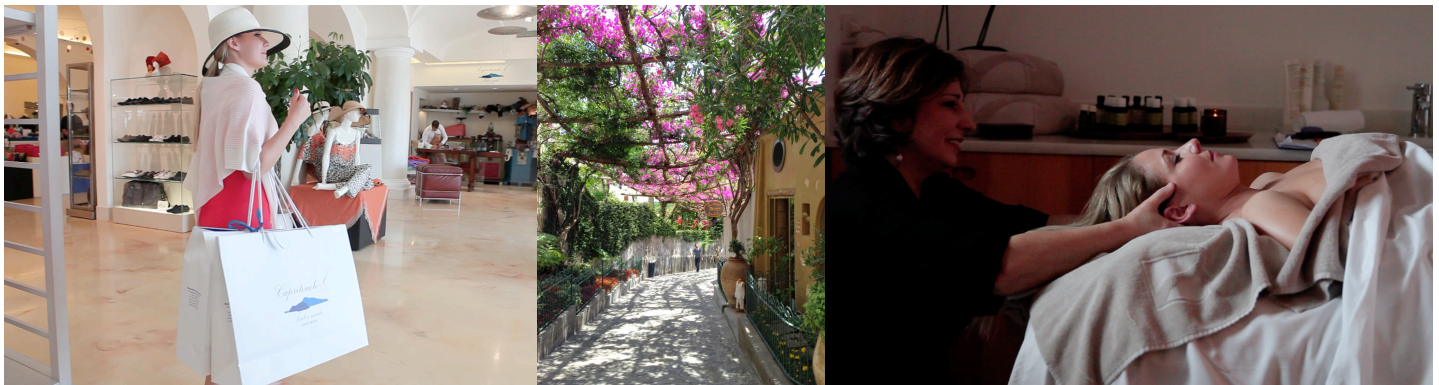
Upon arriving in Positano, Stefanie was challenged in finding the hotel Le Sirenuse amongst the winding streets and little local shops. However, this proved to be a fantastic way to discover the village. Her stay at this award-winning small family run luxury hotel was indeed a total package on its own with a visit at the hotel's clothing store Emporio Le Sirenuse, to dining at the hotel's restaurant La Sponda with Michelin star chef Matteo Temperini. Stefanie then pampers herself at the SPA, experiencing some of Le Sirenuse's signature massages.

It's a day for the senses as Stefanie wakes up to Positano's beautiful sunrise and starts her day with a yoga session. Positano, Italy

Based in Campania, Positano is a small village on Italy's Amalfi coast. During the first half of the twentieth century, Positano was a relatively poor fishing village and began to attract large numbers of tourists in the 1950s. The location became increasingly popular after John Steinbeck published his essay about Positano in Harper's Bazaar in May, 1953 writing: "Positano bites deep...It is a dream place that isn't quite real when you are there and becomes beckoningly real after you have gone."

Its colourful cobbled streets are lined with traditional cafes, wooden canopies teeming with wisteria and fashionable boutiques. There's a real sense of southern Italy here with delicious pizzerias and stony beaches.

Where to stay?

Le Sirenuse Hotel



Le Sirenuse is an award-winning small family run luxury hotel in an 18th century villa on the Amalfi Coast in Positano Italy. Le Sirenuse opened in 1951, when the Marchesi Sersale turned their summerhouse into a charming Hotel, overlooking the bay of Positano. Today Le Sirenuse has 58 rooms, furnished with all the comforts of a luxury hotel, while maintaining the atmosphere of a private home.

Almost all rooms, suites and junior suites look out over the bay of Positano. Most have a private terrace or balcony and all have whitewashed walls, vaulted ceilings and hand-made tiles on the floors.

The first Emporio Le Sirenuse boutique was opened in 1990 opposite the Hotel's entrance. It has today developed into three units: the original store, a new one next to it and a small one in the hotel's lobby. **The Sirenuse Collection**, launched in 2013, presents cotton caftans and silk dresses for ladies, swimmers and linen shirts for men, embroidered cushions and wrought iron candleholders for your home.

At the Emporio you will also find a unique selection of other brands, like Antik Batik, Odd Molly, Massimo Alba, Aspesi Blu, Philosophy by Alberta Ferretti, Ambas and more. Eau D'Italie, Le Sirenuse signature fragrances and bath and beauty products are sold here.

La Sponda Restaurant



La Sponda restaurant is lit, at dinner, by four hundred candles that create an unforgettable atmosphere. The cuisine is based on local, fresh ingredients and is inspired by the Mediterranean tradition.



Michelin Chef Matteo Temperini

Matteo is a young chef from Tuscany. He was born in Poggibonsi, Florence in 1974. He worked for Alain Duchasse in Paris (** guide Michelin) and Alfonso Iaccarino in Sant'Agata sui due Golfi (** guide Michelin) and Macao. He joined Le Sirenuse in 2008 and became Executive Chef in 2009. His passion towards the Mediterranean flavours, born during his years with Alfonso Iaccarino, is fully expressed in his menu. In 2012 he obtained his first Michelin star.

Matteo's cuisine is the cuisine of the South: fresh fish, ripe tomatoes, extra virgin olive oil, garlic, a lot of vegetables, Mediterranean herbs, lemons from the Amalfi Coast and fresh cheeses. The great Neapolitan tradition is reinterpreted by his expert hands and made lighter, more modern. The result is a very genuine and fresh cuisine; full of the rich flavours of our region and made using very fresh ingredients, preferably local and carefully selected.
